With the blinds at 100/200, heads up lasted only five hands with Julian raising or re-raising every flop. Bruce boldly moved all in blind with his remaining stack of 380. He almost made a straight but 10-8 didn't stand up against A-J.

In addition to pocketing the first place cash of \$330, Julian is the first player this year to also claim the bounty in the same tournament. Maybe now he can afford to by some pants!
